### THE SCHOOL

Morrison Academy Taichung is the central campus of Morrison Academy. MA operates two high schools (grades 9-12) and three elementary/middle schools with a system-wide enrollment of 908. Morrison Academy was founded in 1952 to meet the educational needs of the children of missionaries throughout Taiwan. Morrison seeks to develop a Christ-centered school culture in which all students, from missionary and non-missionary families, experience a Biblically-integrated quality education. Morrison, therefore, structures learning so that students may develop the knowledge, discernment, and abilities to dynamically impact this world as Christians.



### STUDENT BODY & FACULTY

Taichung high school enrollment for the 2017-2018 school year is 207, with students from 22 countries, predominantly the U.S. and Canada. Children of missionaries and other church workers comprise 39% of the student body and 61% are from business families. 20% of our students board in campus dorms or with community families. Of the 68 members of the class of 2018, thirteen nations are represented: U.S., Canada, S. Korea, Australia, Japan, New Zealand, Philippines, Burkina Faso, Hong Kong, Portugal, Moldavia, Switzerland and France. There are 54 students in the junior class, 54 in the sophomore class, and 31 in the freshman class. Six nations are represented by a 50 member high school faculty. Of the 34 instructional staff, 21 have advanced degrees.



### CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Morrison Academy offers a wide range of activities to develop student interests and abilities. Visual and performing arts programs include band, orchestra, two choirs, instrumental ensembles, drama and musical productions, A/V production, graphic design, and various fine arts classes. Athletically, students have the opportunity to participate in soccer, basketball, swimming, track, and volleyball. Morrison students also have the opportunity to participate in student government, Model United Nations, debate club, World Scholars Cup, and a wide range of outreach, community service, and leadership development programs.
